Accreditation of Siam University

This is to certify that Siam University which was established in 1973 as a Technical College was granted the status as a private University by the Ministry of Education on September 5, 1986, Siam University is thus legally accredited by the Government of Thailand. The Graduate School of Business was established also in 1986.

Siam University's all programs have been accredited by the Ministry of Education in Thailand, the highest governmental body governing the education system in the country and by the Civil service Commission of Thailand. In addition, Siam University is a member of the International Association of Universities (IAU), a UNESCO affiliated organization, i.e. Siam is accredited by a UN organization. The president of Siam University, Dr.Pornchai Mongkhonvanit, is also the President Emeritus of the IAU.

Furthermore, Siam University is accredited by the following institutions: Association of Southeast Asian Institutions of Higher Learning (ASAHL): International Association of University Presidents (IAUP): Association of Universities in Asia and Pacific (AUAP): International Association of Europe Hotel Schools (EUHOFA): In addition and most importantly, Siam University has been a member of the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACBS) since February 2011 (certificate enclosed), and a member of the Association of Asia-Pacific Business Schools (AAPBS) since March 2017.

All the IMBA courses offered by Siam University are part of Siam's official, nationally and internationally accredited program.

The Master of Business Administration Program (Thai English and Chinese Programs) of Siam University offers 8 major areas of concentration, namely, Accounting, Marketing, Human Resources, International Business, Finance and Banking, Hotel and Tourism, General

Management and ASEN Studies. The number of students of the three programs currently is about 600.

As for the academic credit, each Siam MBA course provides 3 Thai credits 3(3-0-6), equivalent to 5 ECTS credit points and can normally expressed into ECTS system in terms of workload as follow :-

1. Class-room lectures, attendance and participation,
 - 15 weeks per semester, a period of 3 hours/week 45 hours.
2. Self-study 90 hours.
 - Prior preparation and end of class processing 20 hours
 - Writing of assignments and group work 45 hours
 - Preparation for presentation 25 hours
3. Preparation of mid-term and final exams 45 hours

Altogether, each subject requites a workload of 180 hours.
