COURSE DESCRIPTION

The course “Sociology and Culture in Modern age” is dealing with a new understanding of sociology and cultural values under a globalized context. Due to the globalisation, there is the need to create a new insight on social- and cultural interaction and structures to apprehend global power-relationships and the emerge of political systems. Social Science theories will be discussed and compared among each other to create an academic understanding of cohabiting in an internationalized world. It will highlight social dimensions as culture, religion, and social classes and how they cohere with economic and political relationships. The course offers a diverse approach, including sociology, psychology, and culture to explain the complexity of social-human behaviour in a modern world.
