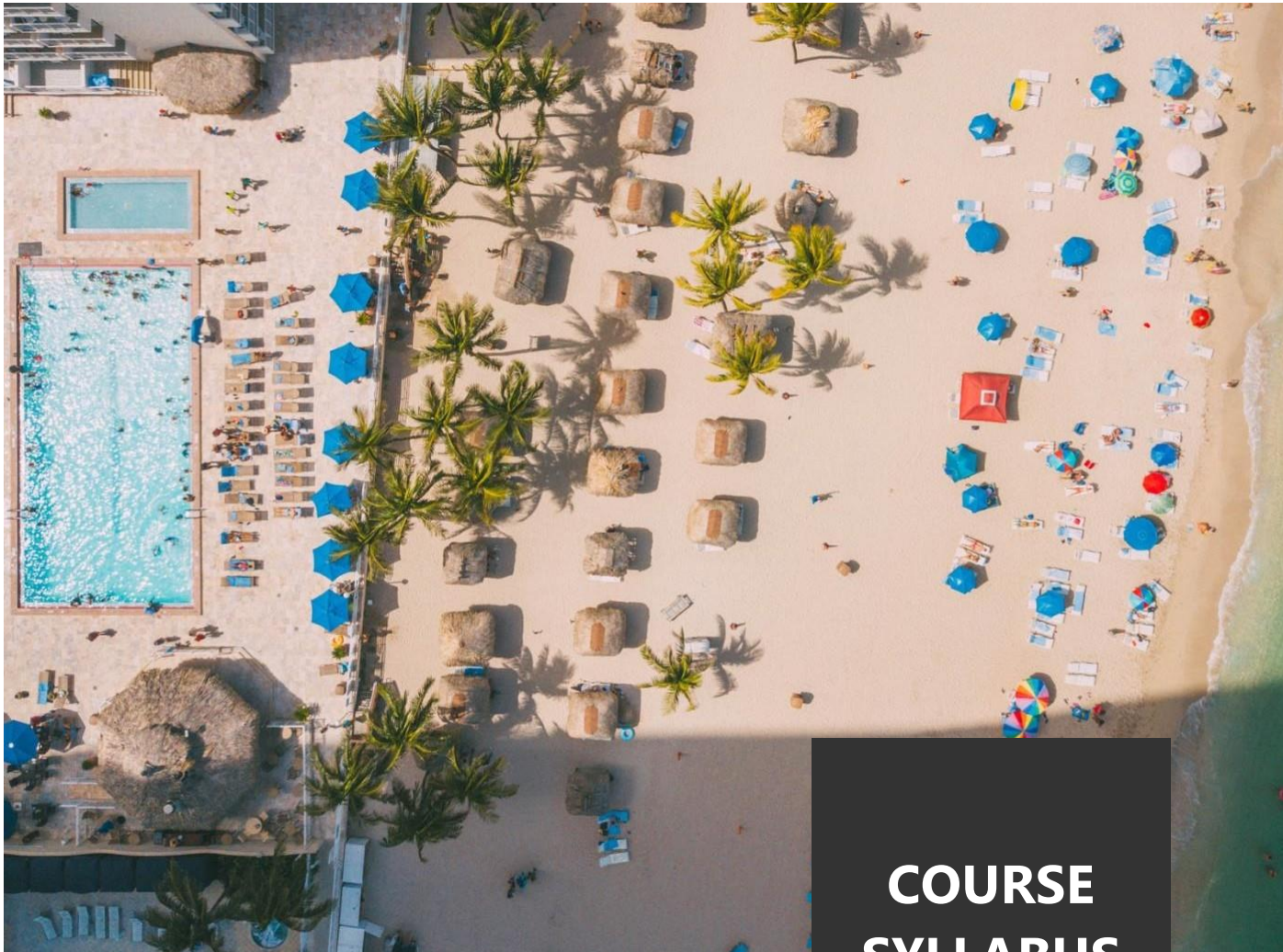

TOURISM DEVELOPMENT IN ASEAN

4 ECTS

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Consist of seven sessions, the course discusses some substantial questions on tourism development in Indonesia, such as how and when tourism started and develops in Indonesia? What are the generating factors? How tourism influence the national economy and the life of Indonesians? Later on, the course will end by discussing available options and path for future development of tourism in Indonesia; whether heading for sustainable tourism that may compromise some economical gain or choosing tourism sustainability that in contrary may compromises sustainability issues.

OBJECTIVES

By the end of this course, the students should be able:

- To describe how the condition of tourism in Indonesia is.
- To understand the early stage of tourism in Indonesia.
- To explain how to generate the power of tourism.
- To describe social, cultural and economic impact of tourism.
